Principal's Message

Dear Parents and Students,

As this is the last Gazette for 2011, I would like to take this opportunity to thank the parents of St George for their support of the school in so many ways. The members of our two parent organisations the P&C and the Mothers' Committee are a group of people totally committed to supporting the staff and students of our school. Both the P&C and the Mothers' Committee have contributed to faculties enabling them to purchase teaching and learning resources and also donated prizes to students at our graduation ceremony and speech day. The P&C have also paid for the installation of air-conditioning in the school hall which was much appreciated by Year 12 during their Trials and HSC examinations. Many successful events have been organised by the P&C and Mothers' Committee which have brought our families together and created a community committed to supporting the values of our school.

I would like to take this opportunity to pay tribute to the teaching staff at St George for their dedication, professionalism and hard work in ensuring that each girl in their care is challenged and encouraged to reach her own personal best in academic and co-curricular activities. I would like to thank the ancillary and support staff, a group of people who contribute immeasurably to the positive culture and climate of our school.

We are bidding farewell to a number of important and highly valued staff members this year. Earlier this year Mr Seed retired from teaching after thirty eight years, the last twenty six of them spent at St George Girls. Mr Jagelman also retired after thirty seven years of teaching, the last eight years spent as Head Teacher Languages at St George. Ms Voss retired after thirty eight years of teaching, the last twenty six years spent at St George. Ms Field retires after thirty six years, the last thirty four years spent at St George. Ms Vourdanos also leaves our school to pursue other career interests. I wish all of these esteemed colleagues the very best for the future and thank them for their dedicated service to our school and to Public Education.

I want to thank our executive team for their leadership of their faculties and in particular my two Deputy Principals, Mr Morris and Mr Ponder for their total commitment to the school and their valuable advice and assistance to me.

I wish all our families a happy and safe holiday. I look forward to working with you again in 2012.

Higher School Certificate and School Certificate Over

I am sure a feeling of relief settled on many families with the final HSC examination. Both the Higher School Certificate and School Certificate Examinations have finished without incident. I was impressed with how well the girls coped with the pressure and supported each other throughout this stressful time. It certainly bodes well for their results that all students seemed satisfied with their performance. Whatever the outcomes I feel sure that all students gave of their best and I know we all will be very proud of them when their results become available.

Peer Support

Year 10 will have their peer support training over two days this week. They will be taken through a series of activities designed to develop their leadership skills and to prepare them to assist Year 7 students in their transition to St George next year. As in previous years, I am sure the girls will thoroughly enjoy the course and gain in confidence as a result. I would like to acknowledge the efforts of the organiser Ms Williamson and all the teachers who volunteered to deliver the course to Year 10.

Year 11

Year 11 will sit for their first HSC Assessment tasks in the week commencing 25 November. It is important that all students familiarise themselves with the school's assessment policy and procedures and follow them. If a student is ill on the day of an assessment task she must contact the school by phone in the morning, obtain a medical certificate and be prepared to sit the task or an alternative task on the first day of her return to school. We wish Year 11 well in the upcoming assessment period.

Important Information and Dates for the Last Two Weeks of School

Our Annual Speech Day will be held on Friday 9 December. Only prize recipients and their parents will attend the ceremony. This will be followed by a ceremony for Year 10 when they will receive their School Certificate. Year 10 students and their parents will attend this assembly. All other students will be granted leave on this day.

Unlike in previous years, however, the week commencing 12 December will be a normal school week for all students from Years 7-11. Students are expected to attend unless they have been granted leave. The last official day of school for students will be Friday 16 December. Monday 19 December and Tuesday 20 December will be School Development Days when staff will undergo professional learning activities.

Some families wish to commence their vacation earlier as they are either travelling overseas or interstate. If you wish your daughter to be granted leave for family reasons please indicate this in writing. Please also state the expected date of her return to school in 2012 so we will retain her position at St George.

The 2012 school year commences on Friday 27 January (staff only) Monday 30 January (Years 7, 11 Peer Support Leaders and new Year 11 students

and Year 12) and Tuesday 31 January (Years 8, 9, 10 and the rest of Year 11). If students are returning to school after these dates, parents must write to me before the end of the year informing me of the details so that leave can be granted.

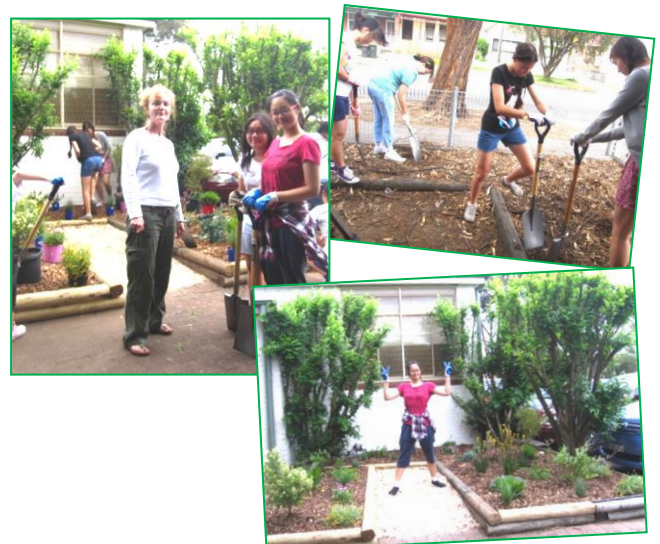
